

## Dogwood Jubilee Rules and Regulations

1. Show start time will be at 9:30 a.m. both on April 28<sup>th</sup> and April 29<sup>th</sup>.  
Registration begins at 8:00 a.m on both April 28<sup>th</sup> and April 29<sup>th</sup>.
2. Stalls are available only at pre-request with the Show Secretary. They must be reserved and cannot be used unless they are reserved! Cost is \$50.00 for the weekend (Friday pm – Sunday pm)
3. All persons must present a negative coggins for each horse that is on the show grounds.
4. There will be a trailering in fee of \$10.00/trailer/day for those who work out of their trailer.
5. The Trail Obstacle class will be held in conjunction with the TWHHA Show and will be open from 3:00-6:00 p.m. Entry fee for that class is \$7.00 and is not included in an All Show Fee Price.
6. The Versatility Class that is held in conjunction with the TWHHA group is to start no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 28<sup>th</sup>, 2012. It will consist of an English Pleasure Class, a Western Pleasure Class, a Pattern Class and Texas Barrels. Winners will receive very nice prizes donated from Sponsors for this class. The cost of the class is \$30.00 per horse/rider combo and can be entered in the Four Beats for Pleasure Dogwood Jubilee.
7. Camping spaces are available, but persons interested must contact the facility for usage and payment options. Four Beats for Pleasure is not responsible for your camper space and will not collect money for your camper space if needed.
8. Horse's may not cross enter into classes. Those showing in Trail Pleasure must only ride in Trail Pleasure or Go As You Please Classes or Versatility classes; those in Country Pleasure must only ride in Country Pleasure or Go As You Please Classes or Versatility Classes; those in Lite Shod may cross over into Plantation as well as ride in Go As You Please and Versatility classes.

9. Horses need to have on the appropriate shoes for the class in which they are entered in. All Trail Pleasure and Lite Shod Horses can wear a Lite Shod Shoe, all Plantation Horses must wear either a Lite Shod or Plantation Shoe. Country Pleasure horses may wear a Keg Shod or Lite Shod shoe.
10. All horses in Model Classes can be shown in either a halter or a bridle. Showmanship at Halter must be in a Halter.
11. GAYP (Go As You Please) Classes are open to any breed of horse and the gaits for the two-gaited class will be a walk and trot/flatwalk/slow rack (etc.). The gaits for the three-gaited class will be a walk, a trot/flatwalk/slow rack (etc.), and canter/lope.
12. A Novice rider is one who has not won three blue ribbons EVER prior to the show on April 28, 2012.
13. A Novice horse is one who has not won three blue ribbons EVER prior to the show on April 28, 2012 .
14. The Academy Class is for riders that are taking lessons and the horses that are used are only to be lesson horses. There will be two gaits called – slow gait (walk, trail walk) and intermediate gait (flatwalk, slow rack, trot).
15. Riders participating in the team riding class, one rider will show the horse the first way of the ring, while the other will complete the second way of the ring. Ribbons will be given to the pair of riders.
16. For persons that pre-enter on the website, you can bring your check/cash to the show and turn it into the show secretary there. No back number will be issued unless payment has been made. Persons that enter online before April 21, 2012 will be entered in a drawing to receive \$20.00 off of their total show bill. One winner announced each day.
17. Persons who are on suspension are not allowed to transport horses to the show and may only participate as a spectator.
