

Rules and Regulations

1. PRE-ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY OCTOBER 15, 2011. Exhibitors may scratch or add classes at the show. All persons that add classes to the All Show Fee at the show will not be charged additional. All persons that add classes and are paying by the class will be charged only the Pre-entry class fee of \$20.00 per class. Any horses that are registered at the show or after the pre-entry date will pay the \$25.00 post-entry fee per class or can do the Post-entry All Show fee for \$200.00. All show fees is per horse/rider combination only. Additional riders must pay per class, either pre-entry or post-entry rate. Payment in full or an open check must accompany entry if mailed, otherwise check/payment can be brought to show office, but all has to be turned in before your entry number will be allowed to be picked up.

All Show Fee for Pre-Entry: \$175.00 Pre-entry
All Show Fee for Post-Entry: \$200.00 Pre-entry
Individual Class Fee: \$20.00 Pre-entry
Individual Class Fee: \$25.00 Post-entry

ALL SHOW FEE AND INDIVIDUAL CLASS FEES INCLUDE BOTH SHOWS. (Show classes cannot be separated!)

2. Poles, Barrels, and Water Glass must ride once for each show. Therefore these classes count as one entry fee for payment purposes.
3. Horses must be entered on entry form for each horse/rider combination with copy of negative coggins test, NWAHA, Amateur/Trainer or Youth Card must accompany the entry form. If your horse is registered, please send a copy of the papers as well if you wish but Registration papers are not required. If this club has any record of a previous bad check you must send a certified check or money order. NO BACK NUMBER WILL BE ISSUED WITHOUT COMPLETE INFORMATION AND AN OPEN CHECK OR PAYMENT IN FULL! NO EXCEPTIONS! If you complete an online entry form, it is up to you to make sure that the Show Secretary has copies of your Negative Coggins, Registration Papers if needed, and copies of your NWAHA Amateur/Trainer or Youth Card, so please make sure that you can present these at the show when you pick up your packet or you can email them to 4beats4pleasure@gmail.com
4. STALL FEES are \$75.00 per horse for the show with two bags of shavings. Stalls will be ready for use on Friday morning after 10am and must be vacated by Sunday evening at Midnight unless prior arrangements have been made with Show Management. Stall assignments are on a first come first serve basis. In case of any emergency please leave your name and number at which you can be reached during the show on your stall so show officials may get in contact with you should there be a problem with your horse.
5. GROUNDS FEE is \$15.00 per horse per day for the show if you are working out of your trailer and not using a permanent stall for the show. Coggins must be displayed on the trailer.
6. Additional shavings may be purchased at the show office for \$7.00 per bag.
7. CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES MUST BE ENTERED IN BY 9:00 a.m. ON OCTOBER 30, 2011. All championship classes will be payback classes that include an additional \$10.00 fee per class entered. The paybacks will be for first, second, and third places and will only be paid back in full if there are more than 4 horses in the class. Classes that have less than 4 riders will have paybacks start at second place.
 - Payback for First Place - \$20.00
 - Payback for Second Place - \$12.50
 - Payback for Third Place - \$7.50
8. REFUNDS OF ENTRY AND STALL FEES may be made minus a \$25.00 office charge per horse upon request before the pre-entry closing date. After the closing date refunds may be made upon request if illness or lameness occurs. Show office requires a certificate issued by a veterinarian on official letterhead stating illness or lameness before the start of the show. Entry fees may then be refunded

minus a \$25.00 office fee per horse. Entry fees may be transferred to a substitute horse at no charge.

9. THE FOUR BEATS FOR PLEASURE CLUB INC will not be liable for any accident, loss, damage, or injury that may occur to an Exhibitor, Owner, Trainer, Agent, Groom, Individual, or Spectator sustained while at the Four Beats for Pleasure Fall Classic Show.
10. THE FOUR BEATS FOR PLEASURE HORSE SHOW COMMITTEE reserves the right to itself of declining to receive any exhibitor, horse or groom without penalty of compensation.
11. This is a show for SOUND HORSES ONLY! Any lame or sore horses will be disqualified from competitions in the show no questions asked and forfeit all entry and stall fees. All breeds of horses will be checked in by the DQP before each class and the first and second place horses will be checked immediately following the class. No chains, action devices, plastic wrap, or hoof bands will be allowed on the grounds or in the stalls or in the show ring.
12. PERSONS ON FEDERAL DISQUALIFICATION CANNOT TRANSPORT HORSES TO THIS SHOW AND CAN ONLY PARTICIPATE AS A SPECTATOR. If any federal disqualified persons are apparent in the outside of the spectator area, they can be directed to the spectator area.
13. CAMPER SPACES with full hookups are available for \$25.00/night. Sign-up with entry and space assignment will be determined by the Barn Manager.
14. THE 2011 FOUR BEATS FOR PLEASURE FALL CLASSIC I AND II ARE AFFILIATED WITH THE NATIONAL WALKING HORSE ASSOCIATION (SOUND HORSE SHOW). THE NWAH RULE BOOK WILL PREVAIL.
15. Country Pleasure horses MAY NOT enter any other TWH division (Trail Pleasure, Lite Shod, or Plantation), but can however enter in Keg Shod Classes. The TWH Trail Pleasure horses may not enter TWH Lite Shod or TWH Plantation Divisions.
16. SSH and Racking horses shall follow the NWAH rulebook AND, RACKING HORSES AND SSH WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO HAVE HOOF BANDS!
17. Classes specified Youth are for exhibitors 17 and under as of January 1, 2011.
18. Classes specified for Adults are for exhibitors 18 and older as of January, 1, 2011.
19. Open classes are specified for Youth, Adult, Trainers, and Amateurs.
20. In the Jumping Classes any English attire, hardhats, footwear with heels, English equipment, and either a snaffle, kimberwick, or pelham bit are required.
21. REFUNDS or accounts deemed payable will be processed and mailed within 30 days after the conclusion of the show.
22. TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES THE ENTRY MUST HAVE BEEN PAID, ENTERED, SHOWN, AND JUDGED IN THE QUALIFYING CLASS.
23. All Championship classes will require an additional \$10.00 fee per class entered because these classes are payback classes. The paybacks will be paid and mailed to the person responsible of the account within 30 days prior to the last day of the show.
24. ALL DRESSAGE, TRAIL OBSTACLE, OBSTACLE DRIVING, PLEASURE DRIVING, HUNTER HACK AND OVER FENCES CLASSES MUST BE PRE-ENTERED. CLASSES WITHOUT THREE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE HELD.

Shoe Size Regulations

Plantation Pleasure and Country Pleasure Racking Horses - shoe size must not exceed ½ inch in thickness or 1 ½ inches in width with no bare plate or other weight inside the shoe. The caulk must not exceed a 1 inch turnback and extend no more than ¼ inch beyond the hoof at the toe. No hoof bands will be allowed.

TWH Lite Shod Pleasure and Trail Pleasure Classes - Must not exceed 3/8 inch in thickness or ¾ inch in width with the exception of the caulk, which must be no thicker than ¾ inch. Turnback shall not exceed 1 inch and shoe must not extend more than ¼ inch beyond the hoof at the toe. No hoof bands allowed.

Country Pleasure - Must not exceed 3/8 inch in thickness or 3/4 inch in width. No hoof bands allowed.

Keg Shod - Any horse from any division wearing keg shoes As specified in the NWHHA rule book or barefoot horses may show in Keg Shod classes.

SSH Lite shod Classes - Shoe size must not exceed 1 inch wide and 3/8 inch thick, with the exception of the caulk, which must be no thicker than 3/4 inch and the turnback shall not exceed 3/4 inch. No hoof bands allowed.

SSH Trail Pleasure Classes - must not exceed 3/8 inch in thickness or 3/4 inch in width with the exception of the caulk, which must be no thicker than 3/4 inch. Turnback shall not exceed 1 inch and shoe must not extend more than 1/4 inch beyond the hoof at the toe. NO hoof bands allowed on the grounds.

Definitions

Amateur Status - National Walking Horse Association Amateur Status definitions will prevail for all classes of the Four Beats for Pleasure Fall Classic I and II.

Novice rider Class: rider nor the horse cannot have one more than three blue ribbons prior to this show.

Rule Book Preferences

Tennessee Walking Horse, Racking Horse, and Spotted Saddle Horse classes will follow the National Walking Horse rule book.
